


# Global Tropics Hazards/Benefits Assessment - Climate Prediction Center - Issued: 7/13/2009

## Week 1 Outlook – Valid: July 14 – July 20, 2009



- 1. An increased chance for tropical cyclogenesis for the eastern Pacific.** A current well developed disturbance with active convection is showing signs of organization and it may become a tropical cyclone early in the period. Consult updates from the National Hurricane Center. **Confidence: High**
- 2. An increased chance for below-average rainfall for parts of Mexico and Central America.** Numerical forecast guidance indicates a weak period in the North American Monsoon which is expected to result in decreased rainfall. **Confidence: Moderate**
- 3. An increased chance for above-average rainfall for parts of Southeast Asia, the Philippines and the western Pacific.** A combination of the Southeast Asian monsoon, subseasonal tropical variability and above-average SST's are expected to result in enhanced rainfall in the area. **Confidence: Moderate**
- 4. An increased chance for below-average rainfall for parts of the Maritime Continent.** El Nino conditions is expected to result in decreased rainfall in this region. **Confidence: Moderate**



### Week 2 Outlook – Valid: July 21 – July 27, 2009
